About DVSF

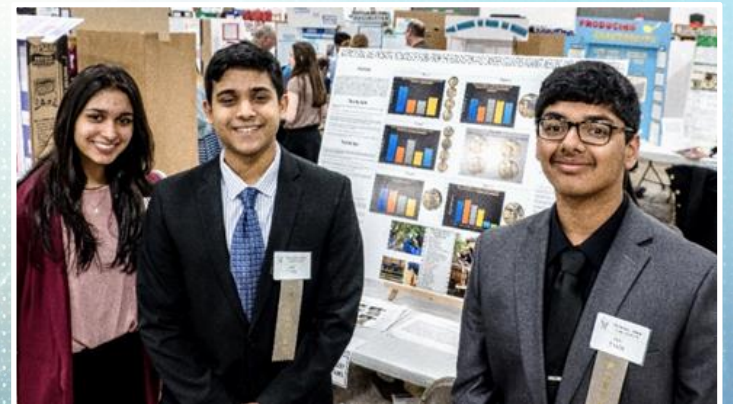
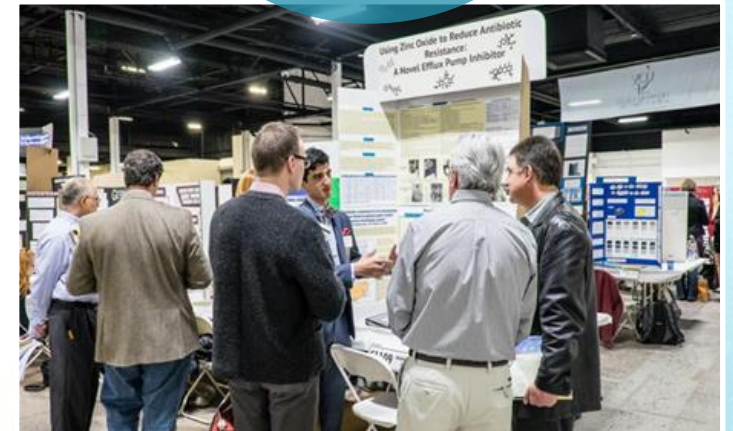

DVSF, established as a nonprofit organization in 1993, is one of the oldest and most successful science organizations in the country.

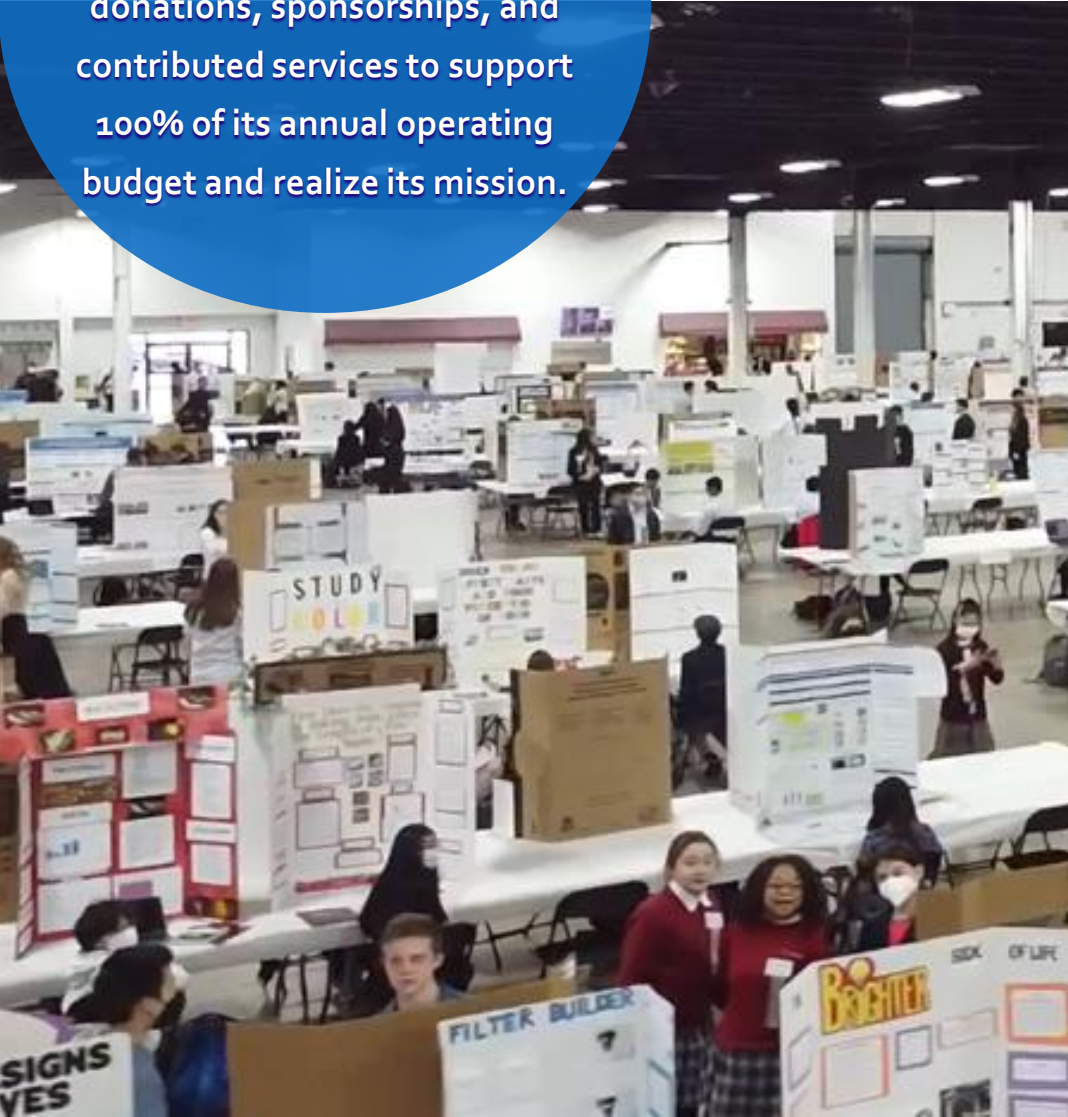
